**Paul's Goals for This Trip:**

*He traveled through that area, speaking many words of encouragement (parakaleo) to the people, - Acts 20:2 (NIV)*

Encouragement: parakaleo - to call to one's side, exhort, console, encouragement, comfort, strengthen, instruct, teach (Thayer's)

**To** \_\_\_\_\_ **for the Church in Jerusalem**

**While Paul was at Ephesus (57AD) he wrote to Corinth:**

*...now concerning the collection for the saints, as I have given orders to the churches of Galatia, so you must do also: On the first day of the week let each one of you lay something aside, storing up as he may prosper, that there be no collections when I come. And when I come, whomever you approve by your letters I will send to bear your gift to Jerusalem. - 1 Corinthians 16:1-3 (NKJV)*

**Paul Comes to Greece (Corinth) (v.2)**

**In Corinth Paul writes the Roman Church:**

*I am going to Jerusalem to minister to the saints. For it pleased those from Macedonia and Achaia to make a certain contribution for the poor among the saints who are in Jerusalem. - Romans 15:25-27*

*Now I know that none of you...will ever see me again. - Acts 20:25*

(v.4)

*I Tertius, 3<sup>rd</sup> who write the epistle, salute you in the Lord. Gaius my host, and of the whole church, saluteth you. ...and Quartus 4<sup>th</sup> the brother. - Romans 16:22-23*

**Paul in Troas (vv.7-12)**

*On the first day of the week, when we were gathered together to break bread, Paul began talking (dialegomai) to them, intending to leave the next day, and he prolonged his message until midnight. (v.7)*

**First Day of the Week:** \_\_\_\_\_ (v.7)

*One person regards one day above another, another regards every day alike. Each person must be fully convinced in his own mind. - Romans 14:5 (NASB)*

*Therefore no one is to act as your judge in regard to food or drink or in respect to a festival or a new moon or a Sabbath day — things which are a mere shadow of what is to come; but the substance belongs to Christ. - Colossians 2:16-17 (NASB)*

*And there was a young man named **Eutychus** sitting on the window sill, sinking into a deep sleep (hupnos); and as Paul kept on talking (dialegomai), he was overcome by sleep and fell down from the **third** floor and was picked up dead. (v.9)*
