Bottomless Pit: Abussos

Seeing Jesus, he cried out and fell before Him, and said in a loud voice, "What business do we have with each other, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg You, do not torment me." - Luke 8:28 (NASB95)

Have You come here to torment us before the time?" - Matthew 8:29 (NASB)

*And they begged Him that He would not command them to go out into the abyss (*abussos*). - Luke 8:31 (NKJV)*

*Then I saw an angel coming down from heaven, holding the key of the abyss (*abussos*) and a great chain in his hand. And he laid hold of the dragon, the serpent of old, who is the devil and Satan, and bound him for a thousand years; and he threw him into the abyss, and shut it and sealed it over him, so that he would not deceive the nations any longer, until the thousand years were completed; after these things he must be released for a short time. - Revelation 20:1-3 (NASB95)*
